Berry Summit Vista Point



PROJECT OVERVIEW

Berry Summit is situated in at least three overlapping tribal territories on the Trinity Scenic Byway, State Route 299. This Clean California project will improve and upgrade this important vista point to highlight the lives and history of the indigenous people inhabiting the area, including the Yurok, Hoopa Valley, and Karuk tribes.

This popular spot for photos of breathtaking views lacks services for travelers. Enhancements for Berry Summit Vista Point include improved litter collection, toilet facilities, picnic area and native, drought-tolerant planting, improved lighting, decorative trash bins, electric vehicle charging stations, and informational kiosks.

This project improves services to historically excluded communities, as well as providing a sense of appreciation to the location. The enhancements will reduce litter, improve safety for users, and add value to the area.

Partners for the project include the Yurok, Hoopa Valley, and Karuk tribes, Blue Lake Rancheria, Humboldt County, County Department of Health and Human Services, Humboldt County Association of Governments, CHP-Humboldt, and the Redwood Coast Energy Authority.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

- 1. Project begins: Summer 2021.
- 2. Construction: November 2022 June 2023.
