PROJECT OVERVIEW

State Route 255 crosses over Humboldt Bay spanning from Eureka to Samoa. The Samoa Bridge Murals project enhances recreational use areas in the community by beautifying four land-based columns of the bridge.

The improvements will benefit low-income neighborhoods by adding value and fostering local pride through the enhancement of infrastructure that dominates the landscape. Public art also decreases litter and discourages graffiti.

The Greater Eureka area is known for its vibrant arts community. Caltrans partnered with the City of Eureka and the Eureka Street Art Festival for the project.


The Eureka Street Art Festival is a week-long, city-wide summer event. The festival provides intentional, accessible art to beautify public spaces, stimulate revitalization, and attract visitors.
