Efficient and Reliable Travel Along the I-5 Corridor

Caltrans is preparing the I-5 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan (CMCP), a longrange comprehensive planning document, with the goal of achieving a more balanced transportation system that addresses community and environmental impacts. It will identify and prioritize potential improvements that address all modes of transportation on the corridor. The CMCP will facilitate and allow collaboration between Caltrans, local and regional partners to apply to regional, state, and federal funding programs.
