Subject: Relocation Impact Document Survey Processes

This memorandum is being provided to all Region/District Right of Way (R/W) Offices and Environmental Offices to clarify the process for conducting surveys in preparation of Relocation Impact Documents (RID).

Agents are reminded that interviews and/or surveys are generally only conducted when preparing the final RID, after the preferred alternative has been selected. Personal interviews are then preferred, but in rare cases surveys can be mailed out with an adequate explanation of the purpose of the survey and how to complete it. Only in extremely rare circumstances should interviews or surveys be conducted at the draft RID phase, and only when "a significant number of the displacees have special needs as to finding suitable replacement property" (10.02.05.03 & 10.02.05.05).

Please ensure that all agents preparing RID's are familiar with the required RID manual survey processes and the need to be clear in their communications with property occupants.
