The transfer is to streamline the Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP) program. The purpose of the LSRP program is to assist local agencies in developing safety plans that are tailored to the protocols, needs, and issues of traffic safety at the local level. The LSRP program addresses the 4E's of traffic safety (Engineering, Enforcement, Education, and Emergency Services) by involving stakeholders, analyzing safety data, identifying safety issues, and prioritizing the countermeasures.
