Fact Sheet

The Mineta Consortium on Transportation Mobility (MCTM, led by the Mineta Transportation Institute at San José State University, was selected as the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) Tier 1 University Transportation Center (UTC) under the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act.

The MCTM unifies and focuses the efforts of four outstanding institutions that represent and support the geographical, cultural, racial, and socioeconomic diversity that makes our nation strong: Howard University; Navajo Technical University; San José State University; and the University of North Carolina Charlotte. This Consortium was designed to foster synergies between leaders in transportation planning, policy, and engineering research, each with a long and distinguished track record of visualizing and deploying cutting-edge, multimodal solutions that meet our nation's mobility challenges.

The MCTM was awarded a five-year grant totaling approximately \$7.3 million from the US DOT, authorized under the FAST Act. The funds are used to conduct transportation research, education, workforce development, and technology transfer activities that will improve mobility of people and goods to make our nation's transportation system safe, efficient, accessible, and convenient for all.

The MCTM plans to lead the nation in researching safe, reliable solutions that increase mobility of people and goods and strengthen the nation's economy. To that end, MCTM research and activities will use a multidisciplinary approach that addresses the complex nature of today's mobility challenges to advance the body of usable transportation knowledge.
