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

# SIREN TEST NOTICE

**T**o prepare for the unlikely event of an emergency at the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS), federal regulations require annual testing of the Community Alert Siren System.

The siren system is a network of 50 sirens strategically placed through the plant's Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ), an area within a 10-mile radius of SONGS. The EPZ includes the cities of San Clemente, Dana Point and San Juan Capistrano as well as the Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, State Parks and some unincorporated areas of Orange County.

**Remember:**

**THIS IS ONLY A TEST**

During the test, you will hear a long, steady siren sound. The sirens will be sounded several times for approximately three minutes each time. In some areas, a separate test of the public address feature may be conducted. This feature may be used in some jurisdictions to alert local populations to other emergencies or provide specific directions.



## In a Real Emergency...

If you hear the sirens sound, turn on your television or radio for instructions. The following radio stations will broadcast emergency information:

During a real emergency, it is possible that you will be directed to shelter in place or evacuate. To understand the difference, please read below.



## Sign up for AlertOC

AlertOC is a mass notification system designed to keep Orange County residents and businesses informed of emergencies. By registering with AlertOC, time-sensitive voice messages from the county or city in which you live or work may be sent to your home, cell or business phone. Text messages may also be sent to cell phones, email accounts and hearing-impaired receiving devices.

An AlertOC message will be sent to the residents of San Clemente, Dana Point and San Juan Capistrano on October 22, 2012, as a reminder of the planned annual siren test.

## Shelter in Place and Evacuation

If you are directed to shelter in place, local officials have determined it is safer for you to stay where you are instead of moving to another location.

If you shelter in place, please stay indoors, turn off air conditioners, shut fireplace dampers and close all vents, windows and doors. If possible, move to an area away from windows and glass. Keep in mind that you may have to remain sheltered for a period of time. For this reason, it is important to prepare an emergency kit that includes at least a three-day supply of food and water per person.

Emergency supplies should also include a portable, battery-operated radio with extra batteries, a non-electrical can opener, wrench or pliers to turn off utilities and a first aid kit with instructions.

If you are directed to evacuate, please **STAY CALM**. Get in your car and drive away from the plant to a location outside the cities of San Clemente, Dana Point and San Juan Capistrano. Be sure to follow the directions of law enforcement officials as traffic patterns are subject to change under these circumstances.

If you know someone in your neighborhood without transportation, please give them a ride. Those without a ride may go to a transportation assembly point listed at [www.songscommunity.com](http://www.songscommunity.com).

If you are directed to evacuate while your children are in school, please **DO NOT** attempt to pick them up. Every school has an emergency plan that provides for reunification.

# Important Things to Know

## Reception Centers at OC Fairgrounds and Camp Pendleton

If the need for an evacuation should arise, a Reception and Decontamination Center will be opened at the Orange County Fair Grounds, 88 Fair Drive in Costa Mesa. The reception center is designed to receive, register and determine additional needs of evacuees. In the event of a radiological release, government health and fire department personnel will be available to monitor evacuees for exposure to radiological contamination and take appropriate actions.

The civilian population at Camp Pendleton will be served by an on-base Reception and Decontamination Center located at the 21 Area Fitness Center (Camp Del Mar). Uniformed military personnel will receive specific guidance from their chain of command.

San Onofre and San Mateo Point housing area residents who have questions concerning the activation of sirens or an emergency during normal working hours may contact the Base Command Center at (760) 725-6283. After normal working hours, contact the Base Command Duty Officer at (760) 725-5061.

In the event of any type of actual emergency, the 52 Area Commander will activate an emergency response cell. San Onofre and San Mateo Point housing area residents may obtain more information during normal working hours by calling (760) 725-7656. After normal working hours, contact the 52 Area Officer of the Day at (760) 725-7480.



## Prepare a Family Emergency Kit

### Water (at least a three-day supply)

- ◆ One gallon per person per day
- ◆ Remember to consider water needs of pets

### Food (at least a three-day supply)

- ◆ Ready-to-eat canned meats, soups, juices, fruits and vegetables
- ◆ High-energy foods such as peanut butter, jelly, crackers, energy bars and trail mix
- ◆ Food for infants, the elderly and those with special dietary needs

### Tools and Supplies

- ◆ Flashlights
- ◆ Portable, battery-operated radios
- ◆ Extra batteries
- ◆ Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ◆ First aid kits and instructions
- ◆ Small amount of cash or travelers checks
- ◆ Non-electrical can opener
- ◆ Map of area
- ◆ Personal hygiene items including diapers and antibacterial wipes
- ◆ Whistle

### Clothes and Bedding

- ◆ Sturdy shoes
- ◆ Rainwear, hats and gloves
- ◆ Blankets and sleeping bags

### Specialty Items

- ◆ Prescription medications
- ◆ Extra pair of glasses or contacts
- ◆ Special needs equipment




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
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


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
