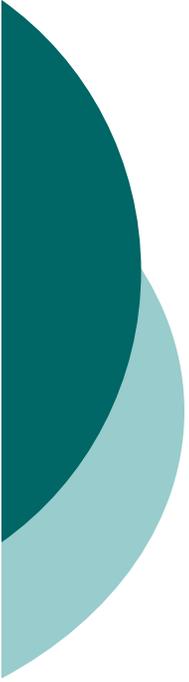




The California Transportation Commission

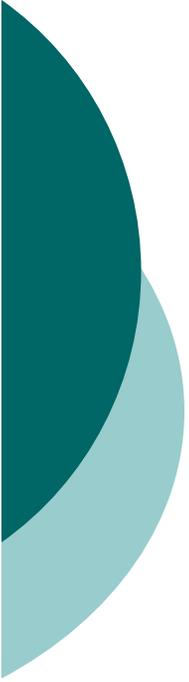

Mission Statement

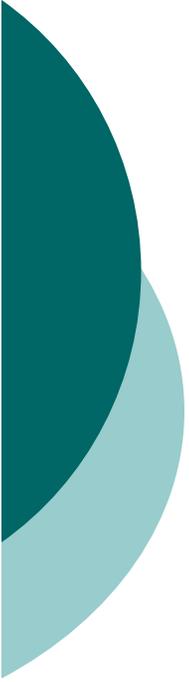

Adopted May 19, 2010

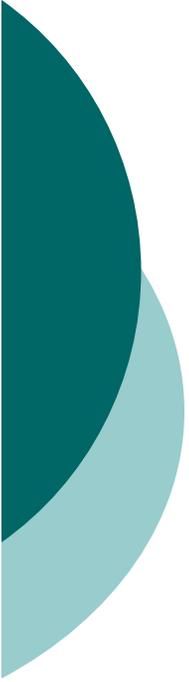




Overall Responsibilities

- Secure financial stability for the State's transportation needs

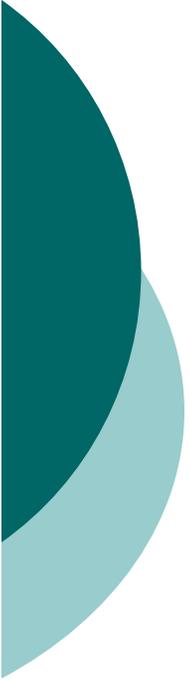




Programs Administered

- State Transportation Improvement Program
- State Highway Operation and Protection Program
- Traffic Congestion Relief Program
- Proposition 1B - Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006
- Seismic Safety Retrofit Program
- State Rail Program and Proposition 1A - the Safe, Reliable High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act of the 21st Century
- Capital grants from the Aeronautics Account and the Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Program Fund
- Proposition 116 - Clean Air and Transportation Improvement Act of 1990





Additional Responsibilities

- Public Private Partnerships and Design-Build Procurement for Transportation Projects (SB 4, 2009)
- High Occupancy Toll Lanes (AB 1467, 2006)
- Right of Way Matters
- Environmental Documents
- Regional Transportation Plan Guidelines and Implementation of SB 375





Shared Responsibilities

- Commission – Programs and allocates funds and approves amendments to project scope, schedule or cost.
- Caltrans – Implements or performs oversight for on-system projects, and provides assistance for off-system projects through Master or Project agreements with regional/local agencies – All funding allocated by the Commission flow through Caltrans.
- Regional/Local Agencies – Prioritize projects at the regional/local level, secure funding commitments, and implement on- or off-system projects in cooperation with Caltrans or others.





Support for the Commission

The Commission may request Caltrans to perform such work as the Commission deems necessary to carry out its duties and responsibilities.
