### 2 CHOOSE FUNDING

Baseline funding sources are the existing sources that pay for transportation maintenance and improvements in the region. There is a total of \$3.9 billion projected to be allocated for transportation projects between 2010 and 2030. These are shown in the table below in 2010 dollars.


