Project Summary:

Develop a Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Master Plan with input from the public and other stakeholders to identify related gaps, needs, improvements and implementation strategies in an effort to increase mobility, safety, network efficiency, and to improve air quality in a manner that's consistent with regional and local efforts including existing and planned infrastructure and land uses.

Community Outreach

- Public input was solicited regarding existing conditions for bicyclists and pedestrians, desired bicycling and walking infrastructure, and types of support facilities or programs needed to improve bicycling in West Sacramento. Public input was also used to develop and prioritize the recommendations.
- Three public workshops were held to solicit feedback on existing issues. Voting boards were displayed at each.
- Online surveys were developed.
- Both a Technical advisory Committee and a community advisory committee were developed, and workshops were held for these groups of stakeholders.

Project Outcome

- Proposals include proposed bikeways, low-stress bikeways, support facilities, bike sharing, and multimodal connections; enhancements for uncontrolled crosswalks, and location-specific recommendations; programs for education, encouragement, and enforcement.

Successes & Next Steps

- A high-priority project action plan was developed, based on cost estimates, community prioritization, and project feasibility.
- Design standards were incorporated for projects enhancing security and coordinating with "Safe Routes to School" projects.
- Federal, state, and local funding sources are being considered.
- Neighborhood electric vehicles, with routes and facilities, are recommended, as well as a transportation plan for these vehicles.
