




## Census Transportation Planning Products (CTPP)




**What?** The CTPP is a collection of specially tabulated Census data products compiled from the American Community Survey and used for transportation planning. The CTPP provides household, personal, and commuting characteristics in addition to the geographic pattern of the home to work commute, commonly known as Journey-to-Work (JTW).

**Why?** States should participate in the CTPP program to take full advantage of a valuable and cost effective tool that provides timely data, training and software and technical support. The CTPP is the only transportation related database that provides data for smaller communities in addition to data by Transportation Analysis Zone (TAZ) and Transportation Analysis District (TAD).

**How?** The CTPP supports activities in transportation planning such as corridor and project studies, environmental analyses and emergency operations management through forecasting population, examining travel behavior and the development and validation of travel demand models.

**Products?** The CTPP provides one, three and five year aggregated tabulations which include: residence-based data, workplace-based data and commuter flows from home to work. Access to data and training is web-based.

**Partners?** In 1990, 2000 and again in 2006, the American Association of Highway Transportation Officials (AASHTO) partnered with all states on pooled fund projects to support the CTPP.



**Who will benefit?** CTPP enhances the development of well-researched planning documents. Smaller California communities will have access to current travel behavior data to base their planning decisions.
