## **ALLOCATIONS FOR EMERGENCY PROJECTS** **INFORMATION**

### **BACKGROUND**

The California Transportation Commission by Resolution G-11, as revised by Resolution G-94, delegated to the Department of Transportation (Department) authority to allocate funds to correct certain situations caused by floods, slides, earthquakes, material failures, slipouts, unusual accidents or other similar events. This allows the Department to immediately begin corrective action in an emergency condition without waiting for the next CTC meeting to receive an allocation.

This authority is operative whenever such an event:

1. Places people or property in jeopardy.
2. Causes or threatens to cause closure of transportation access necessary for;
  - a. Emergency assistance efforts.
  - b. The effective functioning of an area's services, commerce, manufacture or agriculture.
  - c. Persons in the area to reach their homes or employment.
3. Causes either an excessive increase in transportation congestion or delay, or an excessive increase in the necessary distances traveled.

The G-11 Resolution also requires the Department to notify the California Transportation Commission, at their next meeting, whenever such an emergency allocation has been made.

### **SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS**

Pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution G-11, State funds totaling \$13,764,874 have been allocated for eleven (11) emergency construction projects on the attached list.

Project #1, Route 1 in Mendocino County at 0.6 mile south of Juan Creek Bridge. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for reconstruction of slope, stab trench underdrain and extend 36” downdrain as a result of 02/22/2002 storm damage.

Project #2, Route 36 in Trinity County, from PM 19.0 to 19.5. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for the removal and disposal of unstable material on and above the highway as a result of a 12/28/01 rock slide.

Project #3, Route 299 in Trinity County, near Weaverville from 1.6 miles west of Glennison Gap Road to Court Street. – Supplemental G-11 allocation was necessary to remove additional damaged and burnt trees as a result of 8/28/01 fire.

Project #4, Route 1 in San Mateo County, from PM 13.5 to 14.0, north of Pescadero Road. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for the realignment of roadway as a result of 01/22/2002 storm damage by ocean wave action.

Project #5, Route 1 in Sonoma County at PM 30.3 near Fort Ross. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for a shift of roadway alignment, construction of a pin pile wall, and construction of a soil nail wall due to a slipout that occurred during the storms of late December 2001 and early January 2002.

Project #6, Route 12 in the City of Sonoma from MacArthur Street to Leveroni/Napa Road. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for the removal of 46 diseased Eucalyptus Globulus (Blue Gum) trees and the replacement of Oak trees to prevent future damage such as that caused by one tree falling due to heavy rain and wind on 12/09/01.

Project #7, In and near Santa Barbara at Montecito Separation and Milpas Undercrossing. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for the replacement of damaged bridge rails at both structures due to significant damage as a result of two separate bridge hits. The first hit occurred on 01/31/02 and the second occurred on 02/07/02.

Project #8, Route 47 in Los Angeles County, at Los Angeles/Long Beach Harbor at the Commodore Schuyler-Heim Bridge. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary to complete critical repairs to the steel travelway deck on the bridge roadway as a result of 12/13/01 inspection.

Project #9, Route 213 in Los Angeles County, In Los Angeles and Rancho Palos Verdes at Park Western Drive. – Supplemental G-11 Allocation was necessary to complete installation of a reinforced concrete pipe storm drain in existing street and constructing precast concrete manholes and installing pipe liner.

Project #10, Route 78 at approximately 6.8 km west of the City of Ramona. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for slope repair; slope needed to be stabilized with a soil-nail wall as a result of heavy rains occurring on 11/30/01.

Project #11, Route 91 in Anaheim at East Street Undercrossing. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary to remove and replace damaged steel girder beam as a result of the 11/5/01 overheight load bridge hit.
