Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

ISSUE:

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolutions in the county where the facilities are located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facilities to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agencies identified in the summary. The facilities are safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution R-3809 – 04-Nap-29-PM 12.9/13.1
(Request No. 56085) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Napa along Route 29 on Redwood Road, Trancas Street, California Boulevard, and Permanente Way, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated May 1, 2001, by Resolution No. R2010 122 dated September 7, 2010 and by letter dated September 16, 2010, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3810 – 05-SLO-41-PM 41.2/43.8
(Request No. 11487) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way through the community of Shandon, in the county of San Luis Obispo, on Route 41 from the intersection of Route 41 and West Centre Street to Route 46, consisting of highway right of way superseded by a transfer of state highway location. The County, by Resolution No. 2011-149 dated May 17, 2011, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3811 – 10-SJ-99-PM 22.5/23.2
(Request No. 16495) – 4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of San Joaquin along Route 99 from 0.4 mile south of East Hammer Lane to 0.3 mile north of East Hammer Lane, consisting of collateral facilities. The County, by freeway agreement dated August 15, 2006, by relinquishment agreement dated August 15, 2006, and by amendment no. 1 to agreement dated April 15, 2009, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
